

Han Somsen is currently professor in European Union Law, vice-dean research of Tilburg Law School, and director of Tilburg Graduate Law School. Until January 2011, he was director of the Tilburg Institute of Law & Technology (TILT), a multi-disciplinary research group counting some 30 staff (22 fte) hosted by Tilburg Law School.

Han's academic perspective is derived from work experience at international research institutions including Warwick University (United Kingdom), the University of Hull (United Kingdom), and the European University Institute (Italy). In addition, Han has had visiting appointments in Florence (Italy), Sydney (Australia), Irvine (California) and Victoria (Canada).

Han specialises in issues of international, European and domestic technology law, as well as EU law, with a particular interest in EU environmental law. He was founder and for many years editor of the *Yearbook of European Environmental Law* for Oxford University Press, and series editor of Edward Elgar's Law & Biotechnology Series. He is also co-founder and co-editor of the refereed Journal *Law, Technology and Innovation* (with Professor Roger Brownsword, King's College London, 2009).

Han is a prolific researcher with numerous international publications in books and (refereed) journals. He is one of very few legal scholars that won a PIONIER (vici) grant. That multi-annual programme was successfully completed in 2011. Han regularly speaks at home and abroad. He currently supervises two Ph.D students in the areas of biotechnology law and geoenvironment.
