
Conclusions - Int'l Law & Tech

- in other areas, regulatory design should be oriented on promoting second order values such as transparency and deliberation





 - encode second order values needed to enable mechanisms designed to promote first order values
- design principles
 - employ automation at extremes
 - in other areas
 - regulate at higher levels
 - keep humans in the loop
 - involve multiple modalities
