

Okey Chris Iheduru is a professor of Political Science and Director of Undergraduate Studies in the School of Politics and Global Studies at Arizona State University. His current research interest is on the role of private regulatory authority and civil society in regional integration, with regional focus on Africa's banks, infrastructure and natural resources. He has over 60 scholarly papers, including a university press book, in national and international outlets. In 2011-2013, Iheduru was a Visiting Professor of Strategic Studies at the National Defence College and a LEADS Fellow at the National Universities Commission, both in Abuja, Nigeria. He was previously a Visiting Professor of Political Science at Rhodes University, University of Johannesburg and the Africa Institute, all in South Africa in 2000-2001. He is also a two-time recipient of the U.S. Fulbright Fellowship in South Africa and Ghana, respectively; and currently serves on the Experts Committee of the *Abidjan Convention on Marine Environment and Coastal Resources* of the United Nations Environment Program; as well as on the African Capacity Building Foundation based in Harare, Zimbabwe.
